ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of ACC Jain College of Education, Suri, West Bengal dated 02/09/2009 is against the Order No. ERC/7.99.6(1).12/2009/1063(1) dated 05/08/2009 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds " 1) The institution has not appointed teaching/non teaching staff as per NCTE norms. As per the documents submitted by the institution, the institution has only identified the teachers and as per the list teaching staff submitted have been identified. Teaching staff is yet to be appointed. 2) The institution has not submitted the downloaded copies of affidavit of Rs.100/- reg. land & building, and Rs.100/- affidavit from the management regarding selection of staff, Rs.10/- reg. individual teaching staff as per the NCTE norms"

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, ACC Jain College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 08/09/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Lachman Bandyopadhyaya, Treasure and Shri. Pasanta Karnakar, ACC Jain College of Education, Suri, West Bengal presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution has already submitted the list of faculty and other details in response to the Letter of Intent prior to recognition issued by the ERC on 5-6-09. Subsequently, the ERC vide its letter 13-6-09 asked for submission of (i) Downloaded copies of affidavit on Rs.100 Stamp Paper regarding land and building, (ii) Affidavit on Rs.100 Stamp Paper regarding staff and (iii) Affidavit on Rs.10 on Stamp Paper for individual teaching staff and (iv) The appointment letter and joining report for both teaching and non-teaching staff. It was further submitted that the requisite details were submitted to the ERC and the same were received by them on 24-7-09.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the requisite documents were furnished by the institution and the same were available on the file. The Council also noted that the staff appointed was as per the NCTE norms. Therefore, the Council was of the view that there was adequate ground for accepting the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and reversed ERC's order dated 05.08.09. Accordingly, the appeal was accepted and ERC's order dated 05.08.09 was reversed with direction to the ERC to grant recognition to the institution immediately.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby reverses the Order appealed against.

In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that requisite and required number of teaching staff possessing qualification as per the NCTE norms had been appointed by the institution.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the staff appointed including the Principal and two Lecturers who belonged to the ST, were qualified. the Council was therefore, of the view that there was adequate ground for accepting the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and reversed ERC's order dated 06.08.09. Accordingly, the appeal was accepted and ERC's order dated 06.08.09 was reversed with the direction to the ERC to grant recognition to the institution within 15 days of issue of this order.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby reverses the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS the appeal of Banshidhar Mahavidyalaya, Jalaun Dist., Uttar Pradesh dated 02/09/2009 is against the Order No. F. NRC/NCTE/F-7/UP-1924/141 Meeting/2009/6070 dated 10/07/2009 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting BTC course on the grounds "The list of appointed faculty as per NCTE norms has not been submitted till date".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Banshidhar Mahavidyalaya (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 08/09/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Amit Agrawal, Jt. Secretary, Banshidhar Mahavidyalaya, Jalaun Dist., Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the HOD appointed was qualified but in case NCTE was of the view that the HOD was not qualified it should consider relaxing the norms as the institution could not get another HOD despite making several advertisements.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the NRC vide its letter dated 01-12-08 informed the institution that HOD was not qualified without specifying how he was not qualified. the Council, was therefore, of the view that the case should be remanded back to the NRC for examining whether adequate faculty for all the teacher education courses including the proposed BTC course were available with the institution as the institution was running a number of teacher education courses i.e. B.Ed. (2 units) , B.P.Ed. and M.Ed. also.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report, and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation the Council reached the conclusion that the case should be remanded back to NRC for re-examining the faculty profile of all the existing courses namely B.Ed. (2 units), M.Ed., B.P.Ed. and others, if any, including the proposed BTC course after obtaining relevant documents. Accordingly, the Council remanded back the case to the NRC for further action.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Banshidhar

Mahavidyalaya, Jalaun Dist., Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution has removed the deficiencies pointed out to it by the NRC and therefore the Council was of the view that the case should be remanded back to the NRC for further processing of the case for issuance of Letter of Intent prior to recognition.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report, and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation the Council reached the conclusion the appeal to be accepted, set aside NRC's order and remand the case to NRC for further processing for issue of Letter of Intent prior to recognition. A duly filled up affidavit in prescribed format has not been submitted again. 2) The registering authority and date was not mentioned in the affidavit. 3) Enclosure of Col.5 was not mentioned in the affidavit. 4) Certified copy of registered land lease/ ownership documents has not been submitted as per Regulation 8(8) & 8(7).(Duly notarized English version of land documents also to be submitted). 5) Approved building plan from competent authority with plot no., Khata no., Built up area, Total area, khasra no. etc to be submitted for the proposed D.Ed course. As stipulated in the instructions enclosed with the application proforma prescribed under clause 5(1) of the NCTE (Recognition norms & procedure) Regulations, 2007 approved building pan along with Completion certificate (if the building has already been constructed) from the concerned competent authority is required to be submitted. 6) Building completion certificate from the competent authority mentioning the plot no., Khata no., Built up area, Total area, khasra no. etc to be submitted for the proposed D.Ed course.(if the building has already been constructed) from the concerned competent authority is required to be submitted. 7) Certificate from the govt. that the course is not self-financed and that is fully financed by govt. 8) As per letter dt.22/06/2009 the buildings are nearby completion, the completion certificate will be produced soon".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, English and Foreign Languages University (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 08/09/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. S. Mohanraj, Professor, English and Foreign Languages University, Shillong, Meghalaya presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that all the requisite documents were furnished by the institution to the ERC.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution had removed all deficiencies pointed out to it by the ERC. the Council was therefore of the view that the case should be remanded back to the ERC for further processing of the case for getting the institution inspected.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal, set aside ERC's order and to remand the case back to ERC for causing inspection of the

institution within 30 days of issue of this order to ascertain the availability of adequate infrastructure and other facilities as per NCTE norms and thereafter to pass appropriate order.

WHEREAS the appeal of Gurupad Primary Teacher's Training College, Garhwa, Jharkhand dated 02/09/2009 is against the Order No. ERC/7-98.8.3/2009/863 dated 27/07/2009 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.Ed course on the grounds " 1) The institution has not submitted reply to ERC notice dated 05/06/2009 within the prescribed time limit. 2) The institution is required to submit the building completion certificate mentioning therein Khasra no., Plot no., details of total land area, built up area which should be as per the approved building plan & land documents of the institution and same should be suitable to run teacher training course as per the NCTE norms duly approved by Govt. Engineer and countersigned by the authority concerned. 3) Enclosure of Col. 5 of affidavit has not been submitted".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Gurupad Primary Teacher's Training College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 08/09/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Rav Bahadur Singh, Trust Member and Shri. Sudis Narayan Thakur, Member, Gurupad Primary Teacher's Training College, Garhwa, Jharkhand presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that reply to ERC's letter 5-6-09 was sent by the institution by fax on 3-7-09 and that the building of the institution was completed as per the approved building plan and the building was suitable for D.Ed. course.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the reply of the institution dated 3-7-09 purported to have been sent was not available on the file. The council further noted that the available area of land are indicated in the application was 1085 Sq.mts. as against the requirement of a minimum of 1500 Sq.mts. as per the NCTE norms. the Council, was therefore, of the view that the institution did not fulfill the NCTE norms and therefore the rejection of the application by the ERC was on valid grounds and there was no ground to accept the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during presentation the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and ERC's order dated 27-07-09 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS the appeal of International School of Human Resources and Social Welfare Society(M.F.International Minority B.Ed College), Patna, Bihar dated 04/09/2009 is against the Order No. ERC/7-92.8.58/1-2009/15261 dated February, 2009 as confirmed vide letter No.ERC/7-99.7(13)/1/2009/11213 dated 06.08.09 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds "The committee considered the case of the institution and upon consideration of the original institution file alongwith relevant documents, the reply dated 26/06/2008 in response to ERC deficiency letter dated 09/05/2008 and representation dated 22/12/2008 in response to ERC notice dated 20/12/2008 as well as NCTE Hqr. letter dated 19/05/2008 alongwith a copy of the Ld. Commissioner's order dated 23/04/2009 and also legal notice dated 13/05/2009, the committee noted that the land of the institution has been registered after due date prescribed as per the NCTE regulations. Therefore, the committee decided to reconfirm its earlier decision for refusal of recognition under section 14(3)(b)".

AND WHEREAS Dr. M. The appellants aggrieved by the objections and the orders of the respondent filed their petition u/s 11 of the National Commission for Minority Educational Institution Act 2006 which was registered as petition no. 72/2009 and was disposed off vide order dated 23/04/2009 with direction to the respondent to grant recognition of B.Ed course proposed to be run by the appellants from the session 2009-2010, if the appellants comply the necessary requirements of the respondent. The appellants in compliance of the said order got the lease deed of the land converted into registered Sale Deed in favour of the Appellant no. 2 i.e. M.F. International Minority B.Ed College and has also complied all the provisions within the time given by the Hon'ble Commission in order dated 23/04/2009. (2). The appellants submitted all the documents in order to remove the deficiency raised in letter dated 20/10/2008 alongwith a copy of the order of the Hon'ble Commission in the office of the respondent through Speed Post on 30/04/2009. A copy of the letter for submitted the documents with the prove of the Speed Post was shown to the committee.

AND WHEREAS Dr. Harender Singh Rawat, President and Dr.(Mrs.) Savita, Rawat, Principal, Nalanda College of Education, Dehradun, Uttaranchal presented the case of the appellent institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution was having all the requisite infrastructural and other facilities as per the NCTE norms and therefore withdrawal of recognition of the institution by NRC was not in order. WHEREAS the appeal of Prajna Educational Trust (Prajna D.Ed College), Hassan, Karnataka dated 13/08/2009 is against the Order No. F.SRO/NCTE/D.Ed/2009-2010/14806 dated 28/07/2009 of the Southern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.Ed course on the grounds " 1) The First Floor of the building roofed with asbestos which is not suitable to run the proposed D.Ed course as per para 8(10) of NCTE regulations, 2007. The VCD, the visiting Team Report indicates that the first floor is roofed with asbestos sheet whereas the building completion certificate indicates that the first floor is roofed with RCC. 2) The Building Completion Certificate provided by the Management is not in conformity with the VT report. The built up space mentioned in Building Completion Certificate of 28,694 sq. ft. whereas the Visiting Team report stated that only 11,692 sq. ft. is available including first floor. It is also misleading to the SRC, NCTE".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Prajna Educational Trust (Prajna D.Ed College) (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 26/08/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. C.S. Jadimaih, Principal and Ch. Laxama, Chairman, Prajna Educational Trust (Prajna D.Ed College), Hassan, Karnataka presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the management of the institution had constructed the full-fledged two storied building with the built-up area of 28690 sq.ft. Due to heavy rain in the area, earlier the first floor of the building was covered with asbestos sheet but after the deficiency was pointed out by the VT, the asbestos sheets were removed and the first floor was also covered with RCC roofing. AND WHEREAS the Council noted that as per the building plan submitted the built-up area of the institution was 11827 sq.ft. as against the requirement of 16164 Sq.ft. and size of the classrooms was also not as per the NCTE norms. the Council was therefore of the view that the institution did not fulfill the requirement as per the NCTE norms and therefore there was no justification for accepting the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and hence it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and NRC's order dated 15-07-09 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

In reply to showcause notice, the University College stated that the steps have been already taken for the construction of the building with 1220 sq. ft. using MLA fund. The University College was accorded recognition on 13/07/2004, with the condition that the University College shall be shifted to its own premises/building within three years (12/07/2007) from the date of issue of order. The University College has not constructed own building with adequate build up space for B.Ed course with 165 intake as per stipulated conditions of recognition order. Hence, the University college is not eligible to continue in the rented premises as per the rules and Regulations, Norms and Standards of NCTE 3) The built up space of 12320 sq. ft. is not adequate for B.Ed course. The new building in under construction and it is also not adequate. The college has not submitted any evidence in respect of progress of completion of building. 4) The furniture is not adequate to run the course. The University College has placed order to purchase furniture as per reply to the notice issued. 5) The University College has not appointed teaching faculty on regular basis as per norms and standards of B.Ed course. In its reply to notice the college has stated that the Government concurrence is needed for the appointment of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff in Kerala University. University has taken up the matter to the Government and awaiting for a favourable decision. 6) The University College has not submitted registered own land document as per Regulation. In reply to notice the University College has stated that the matter has been taken up with State Government and the Government has given assurance to lease out the land and building on a long term basis for a period of 33 years. AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Govt. Boys High School Campus(Kerala University College of Teacher Education) (hereinafter referred to as the appellants), preferred an appeal dated 03/08/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Prof. Jacob John Kattakayam, Dean and Shri. P. Raghavan,

Joint Registrar, Govt. Boys High School Campus(Kerala University College of Teacher Education), Pathanamthitta, Kerala presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the Kerala University College of Teacher Education, Adoor, Pathanamthitta, Kerala was functioning in a temporary building and not in rented premises as the building where the college was run belonged to the Govt. school which was allocated by the Govt. to the college. As regards built-up area it was submitted that though the present building was having only 12320 Sq.ft. of built-up area, a new building with 1220 Sq.ft. was getting ready for the college. Therefore, the Council, was of the view that there was no justification for accepting the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. In its reply to notice the college has stated that the Government concurrence is needed for the appointment of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff in Kerala University. University has taken up the matter to the Government and awaiting for a favourable decision. 6) The University Centre is running B.Ed course in self-financing mode as per information provided in its reply given to Notice. But, the University Teacher Education College has not maintained joint account for Rs. 5 lakhs. and Rs. 3 lakhs. FDRs as per para 10(1) of NCTE Regulations, 2007".

AND WHEREAS Prof. Jacob John Kattakayam, Dean and Shri. P. Raghavan, Joint Registrar, Govt. Boys High School(Kerala University College of Teacher Education), Kayamkulam, Alappuzha Dist., Kerala presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the Kerala University College of Teacher Education, Kayamkulam, Alappuzha was functioning in Govt. land and buildings which were not used by the school and transferred to the university to run B.Ed. college and that university constructed its own building and these buildings were not rented. However, the representative informed that they would deposit FDRs for the requisite amount if NCTE so decided.

AND WHEREAS as regard ground of withdrawal of recognition cited at Sl.Nos.1 and 4, the Council noted that the land and building of the college was still on the ownership of the local self government and lease deed is yet to be signed by the Registrar, Kerala University with the local self Government, as per submission made by the appellant. Regarding ground of withdrawal of recognition at Sl.No.2, the institution was running B.Ed course with an intake of 165 students but the built-up area available with the institution was only 16759 sq. ft. as against the requirement of a minimum of 21528 sq. ft. or 2000 sq. mts. for running 2 units of B.Ed course, as per the NCTE norms. Regarding objection at Sl.No.3, the Council noted that the multipurpose hall was roofed with asbestos sheet and the institution did not get it removed even upto on the date of hearing. As regard objection at Sl.No.5, the Council noted that the college has not appointed faculty on regular basis as Government approval was still awaited and therefore appointments made were on contract basis. As for objection at Sl.No.6, the Council noted that the university centre was running B.Ed course in self-financing mode but it was not maintaining fixed deposits as required as per the NCTE Regulations. The Council was therefore of the view that the institution did not fulfill the norms and the recognition of the institution was withdrawn by the SRC on valid grounds and that there was, therefore, no ground to accept the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and SRC's order dated 15-07-09 was confirmed.

appointed faculty on regular basis as Government approval was still awaited and therefore appointments made were on contract basis. As for objection at Sl.No.5, the university centre was running B.Ed course in self-financing mode but it was not maintaining fixed deposits of requisite amount towards endowment and reserve fund as required as per the NCTE Regulations. The Council was therefore of the view that the institution did not fulfill the norms and the recognition of the institution was withdrawn by the SRC on valid grounds and that there was, therefore, no ground to accept the appeal.

The evidence is not submitted for establishing science lab along with reply to the notice".

Higher Secondary School Campus(Kerala University College of Teacher Education), Alappuzha Dist., Kunnam, Mavelikara, Kerala presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that It was functioning in Govt. land and building which were not used by the school and run by university the university constructed its own building and therefore the buildings were permanent and not rented in anyway. Regarding built-up area it was submitted that the available built-up area was 16150 Sq.ft. and for creating more space, a proposal for construction of new building using development funds obtained from MLA/Mp and Development Committee was under consideration. It was also submitted that the teachers recruited by the University were highly qualified and competent; the college was under direct control of the University, and, therefore, the college might be exempted from paying Endowment/Reserve funds but the college was willing to deposit FDRs of requisite amount o the NCTE was not in a position to exempt the college from depositing FDRs. It was further submitted that adequate books in the library was available and the Government of Kerala had authorized the Registrar, Kerala University to enter into long-term lease agreement with the local self-Government in respect of land and building.

Regarding objection at Sl.No.4, the Council noted that the college has not appointed faculty on regular basis as Government approval was still awaited and therefore appointments made were on contract basis. As regard objection at Sl.No.5, the university centre was running B.Ed course in self-financing mode but it was not maintaining fixed deposits of requisite amount towards endowment and reserve fund as required as per the NCTE Regulations. At present there is no own land and building to run B.Ed course as per regulations of NCTE. 5) The University College has not appointed teaching faculty on regular basis as per norms and standards of B.Ed course. In its reply to notice the college has stated that the Government concurrence is needed for the appointment of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff in Kerala University. University has taken up the matter to the Government and awaiting for a favourable decision. 6) The University Centre is running B.Ed course in self-financing mode as per information provided in its reply given to Notice. But, the University Teacher Education College has not maintained joint account for Rs. 5 lakhs. and Rs. 3 lakhs. FDRs as per para 10(1) of NCTE Regulations, 2007. 7) The available furniture is not adequate to run B.Ed course".

AND WHEREAS Prof. Jacob John Kattakayam and Shri. M.P.Raghavan, Govt. Vocational Higher Secondary School for Boy's Campus(Kerala University of Teacher Education), Nedumangad, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala presented the case of the appellat institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the college was functioning in Govt. land and building which was not used by the school and transferred to university to run B.Ed. college and that the university constructed its own building and therefore the buildings are permanent and not rented in anyway; Regarding built-up area it was submitted that in addition to existing 16212 Sq.ft. of built-up area, a proposal for construction of new building with 3075 sq.ft. of built-up space was under consideration and the construction would be completed within 3 months, making available a total built-up area of 19287 sq.ft. It was also submitted that the teachers recruited by the university on contract basis were highly qualified and competent; the college might be exempted from paying the endowment/reserve funds but it was willing to deposit the requisite amount in FDRs if so decided by the NCTE; the Govt. of Kerala had issued GO authorizing the Registrar, University of Kerala to enter into long term lease of land and building with the local self government and

that it was having adequate furniture.

AND WHEREAS as regard grounds of withdrawal of recognition at Sl.Nos.1 and 3, the Council noted that the land and building of the college was neither in the name of the university nor in the name of the college and it was still on the ownership of the local self government and lease deed was yet to be signed by the Registrar, Kerala University with the local self Government, as per submission made by the appellant. Regarding objection at Sl.No.2, the Council noted that the institution was running B.Ed course with an intake of 165 students but the built-up area available with the institution was only 16122 sq. ft. as against the requirement of a minimum of 21528 sq. ft. or 2000 sq. mts. for running 2 units (beyond 100 but upto 200 students) of B.Ed course, as per the NCTE norms. Regarding objection at Sl.No.4, the committee noted that the college has not appointed faculty on regular basis as Government approval was still awaited and therefore appointments made were on contract basis. As regard objection at Sl.No.5, the Council noted that the university centre was running B.Ed course in self-financing mode but it was not maintaining fixed deposits towards endowment and reserve fund as required as per the NCTE Regulations. The Council was therefore of the view that the institution did not fulfill the norms and the recognition of the institution was withdrawn by the SRC on valid grounds and that there was, therefore, no ground to accept the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and SRC's order dated 15-07-09 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

Therefore, the Council was of the view that in order to protect the interest of the students admitted the appeal of the institution should be admitted and status-quo existing prior to refusal of recognition by the NRC should be restored pending inspection of the institution under section 17 of the NCTE Act and thereafter taking appropriate decision by the WRC.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report, and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and set aside the WRC's Order dated 15.07.09. Accordingly, the appeal was

WHEREAS the appeal of Sri Rudreshwara Vidhya Samsthe, Davanagere, Karnataka dated 07/09/2009 is against the Order No. F.SRO/NCTE/D.Ed/2009-2010/14804 dated 28/07/2009 of the Southern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.Ed course on the grounds "1) The built up space stated 6509 sq.ft. as per building completion certificate. The building was inspected on 07/05/2009. The management again submitted one more building completion certificate along with notice reply issue wherein stated that the built up space in ground floor is 10203sq.ft. and first floor 4413sq.ft. The above certificate tempered and corrected to mislead the SRC. 2) The right wing of the first floor is under construction as per reply to notice. 3) the built up space 8978.50 sq.ft. given in the building plan whereas the portion of second floor is under construction. the available space is not adequate as per records".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Sri Rudreshwara Vidhya Samsthe (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 11/09/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Prof. K.S. Gangadhar, Principal, Sri Rudreshwara Vidhya Samsthe, Davanagere, Karnataka presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution was having a built-up area of 13018 Sq.ft. and the VT verified the availability of infrastructural and other facilities on 8-5-09. It was also submitted that construction of right wing of first floor was not at all connected with the built-up area earmarked for D.Ed. course. The representatives informed the Council the institution was prepared for another inspection for which the requisite fee would be paid by it.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that as per the building completion certificate submitted the institution was having a built-up area of 13018 Sq.ft. which was adequate for the proposed D.Ed. course. However, since the built-up area indicated by the VT was only 6509 Sq.ft., The Council was of the view that the case should be remanded back for a second inspection subject to payment of requisite fee of Rs.40,000/- by the institution immediately.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report, and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that the institution should be re-inspected to ascertain availability of necessary infrastructure, instructional and other facilities in accordance with the norms prescribed by the NCTE to become eligible for recognition by NCTE immediately on payment of requisite fee of Rs.40,000 by the institution. Accordingly, the Council remanded back the case to the SRC for re-inspection of the Institution immediately and thereafter, to issue order.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Sri Rudreshwara Vidhya Samsthe, Davanagere, Karnataka to the SRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Vidya Sagar Teacher's Training College, Malda, West Bengal dated 14/09/2009 is against the Order No. ERC/7-99.6(11).(1S).5/2009/11300 dated 06/08/2009 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds " 1) The Principal Dr. Arunima Patnaik & one Lecturer, Ms. Monalish Mohanty are also working in other college namely Vivekanand Teacher Training College, Chandipur, Malda, West Bengal. 2) The download copies of the website of the institution have not submitted as per the NCTE norms".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Vidya Sagar Teacher's Training College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 14/09/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Ram Prabesh Mandal, Member and Shri. Atul Anand, Officer, Vidya Sagar Teacher's Training College, Malda, West Bengal presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the Principal Dr. Arunima Patnaik & one Lecturer Ms. Monalish Mohanty were previously working in another college namely Vivekananda Teacher Training College, Chandipur, Malda and they, after submitting their resignation letters they joined the appellant institution. It was also submitted that downloaded copies of the website of the institution were submitted to the ERC.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that as per the provisions in the NCTE Regulations, the ERC was required to issue a Letter of Intent prior to recognition to the institution after satisfying that the institution fulfilled the requirement regarding infrastructural and other facilities and the question of selection and appointment of qualified staff would arise only thereafter. The Council also noted that the ERC did not follow the prescribed procedure and issue the Letter of Intent prior to recognition. the Council was therefore of the view that the case should be remanded back to ERC for issuing Letter of Intent prior to recognition.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report, and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that the case should be remanded back to the ERC for issuing Letter of Intent prior to recognition. Accordingly, the Council remanded ERC for issuing the Letter of Intent prior to recognition as per the provision in the NCTE Regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Vidya Sagar Teacher's Training College, Malda, West Bengal to the ERC, NCTE, for necessary

action as indicated above.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Saroj Kumar Das, Staff G.D. and Shri. Tarapada Giri, Ex-Principal, Vivekananda Primary Teacher's Training Institute, South 24 Parganas, West Bengal presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution was having all the requisite infrastructural and other facilities and the ERC committed an error substantially in not giving chance to the institution for facing a physical inspection by the visiting team to verify the available infrastructural and other facilities.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that deficiency letter was issued to the institution on 27-11-08 and the institution submitted reply to the ERC within the stipulated time. The Council was therefore of the view that the case should be remanded back to the ERC for examining the response of the institution to the deficiency letter and thereafter taking further necessary action on merits of the case.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report, and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that the case should be remanded back to the ERC for examining the response of the institution to the deficiency letter dated 27.11.08 and, thereafter, taking appropriate decision. Accordingly, the case was remanded back to the ERC.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Vivekananda Primary Teacher's Training Institute, South 24 Parganas, West Bengal to the ERC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of West Govt. High School Campus(Kerala University College of Teacher Education), Anchal, Kollam Dist., Kerala dated 27/07/2009 is against the Order No. F.SRO/NCTE/B.Ed./2009-10/14555 dated 15/07/2009 of the Southern Regional Committee, withdrawing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds "1) The University College was accorded recognition on 27/09/2004 in temporary building with the condition to shift the B.Ed course to the permanent premises within three years (26/09/2007) from the date of issue of order. But the University College has not purchased own land and also not constructed own building till date. The University College has violated the stipulated conditions of recognition order. Hence, the University college is not eligible to continue in the rented premises as per the rules and Regulations, Norms and Standards of NCTE. 2) The University College is running in the school campus as temporary accommodation with inadequate build up space for B.Ed course (165 intake). The University College in its reply stated that the State Government has given assurance to lease out the land & building on a long term basis for a period of 33 years. At present there is no own land and building to run B.Ed course as per regulations of NCTE. 3) The University College is running B.Ed course in self-financing mode as per information provided in its reply given to Notice. But, the University Teacher Education College has not maintained joint account for Rs. 5 lakhs and Rs. 3 lakhs FDRs as per para 10(1) of NCTE Regulations, 2007. 4) The University College has not appointed teaching faculty on regular basis as per norms & standards of B.Ed course. In its reply to notice the college has stated that the Government concurrence is needed for the appointment of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff in Kerala University. University has taken up the matter to the Government and awaiting for a favorable decision. 5) The unregistered lease deed submitted by University College is not valid as per regulations of NCTE. 6) The 6 computers are not adequate for existing B.Ed course with 165 intake as per norms & standards of B.Ed course".

AND WHEREAS Shri. Prof. Jacob John Kattakayam and Shri. P. Raghavan, West Govt. High School Campus(Kerala University College of Teacher Education), Anchal, Kollam Dist., Kerala presented the case of the appellant institution on 13.10.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the college was functioning in Govt. land and building which was not used by the school and transferred to university to run B.Ed. college and that the university constructed its own building and therefore the buildings are permanent and not rented in anyway; Regarding built-up area it was submitted that in addition to existing 16473 Sq.ft. of built-up area, construction of additional 1610 Sq.ft. of built-up space would be made available within 3 months. It was also submitted that the teachers recruited by the university on contract basis and they were highly qualified and competent ; the college was eligible for exemption from paying the endowment/reserve funds but it was willing to deposit the requisite amount in FDRs if so decided by the NCTE and that the Govt. of Kerala has already issued orders authorizing the Registrar, University of Kerala to enter into long term lease of land and building with the local self government.

AND WHEREAS as regard grounds of withdrawal of recognition at Sl.Nos.1, 2 and 5, the Council noted that the land and building of the college was neither in the name of the university nor in the name of the college and it was still on the ownership of the local self government and lease deed is yet to be signed by the Registrar, Kerala University with the local self Government, as per submission made by the appellant. Regarding objection at Sl.No.3, the university centre was running B.Ed course in self-financing mode but it was not

maintaining fixed deposits towards endowment and reserve fund, as required as per the NCTE Regulations. As regard objection at Sl.No.4, the Council further noted that the college has not appointed faculty on regular basis as Government approved was still awaited and therefore appointments made were on contract basis. The Council was therefore of the view that the institution did not fulfill the norms and therefore the recognition of the institution was withdrawn by the SRC on valid grounds and that there was, therefore, no ground to accept the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and SRC's order dated 15-07-09 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

It was also submitted that the Govt. of UP had not started BTC course and therefore formal appointment including that of Head of department could not be made.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that Letter of Intent prior to recognition was issued to institution on 26-7-06. As no reply was received from the institution a reminder was issued by the NRC on 3-7-07 which was replied to by the institution on 21-7-07. The NRC sought further clarification on 26-2-08 and the institution furnished some clarification on 28-4-08 which were not satisfactory and eventually the NRC refused recognition to the institution on 10-7-09. The Council was therefore of the view that the refusal of recognition was on valid ground and there was no ground to accept the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and hence it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and NRC's order dated 10-07-09 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.
