ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Patel College of Education, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh dated 29/09/2009 is against the Order No. WRC/APW07504/225145/223268/121st/2009/57984 dated 24/07/2009 of the Western Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting M.Ed (Co-Ed) course on the grounds "whereas on scrutiny of original file, WRC in its 121st meeting held on 09 July,2009 came to the conclusion that the recognition of B.Ed course has been refused to the institution, the application of M.Ed cannot be processed".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Patel College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 29/09/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Sanjeev Dubey, CEO and Shri. Dinesh Kumar Mishra, Principal, Patel College of Education, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 30-11-09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that on appeal the NCTE, New Delhi has revoked the permission granted for conducting B.Ed. course and in the circumstances non-acceptance of the application for M.Ed. course is arbitrary. The appellant requested that their application for starting M.Ed. may be considered and permission granted.

AND WHEREAS in view of the position stated above, the Council came to the conclusion that the appeal deserves to be accepted, the order of the WRC set aside with the direction to the WRC to process the application for the M.Ed. course.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, and after considering oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and set aside WRC's order dated 24-07-09 and remand the case to the WRC for further processing of the application for M.Ed. course

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Patel College of Education, Ratibad,, Bhopal - , Madhya Pradesh to the WRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Gurukul Bharti College of Education, Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh dated 27/10/2009 is against the Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/F-3/HP-256/147 Meeting/2009/9592 dated 31/08/2009 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds "The deficiencies regarding Science lab, and Language learning facilities still exist".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Gurukul Bharti College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 27/10/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Pankaj Sharma, President and Dr. K.N. Sharma, Gurukul Bharti College of Education, Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 02-12-09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution possessed multiple sets of science apparatus required to perform and demonstrate the experiments prescribed in the syllabus for secondary/senior secondary classes by Himachal Pradesh Education Board Dharamshala. However the exhaust fans and sink were being fitted by the day of inspection. These were fitted and this was communicated to NCTE Jaipur in the reply of show cause. The language learning lab had adequate hardware and software facilities. After the show cause notice the lab was further strengthened by adding more equipment.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the science lab and language learning labs were adequately equipped and this was evident from the purchase bills and stock register entries. In view of the above the Council came to the conclusion that there was adequate justification in accepting the appeal and remand the case to NRC for issuance of letter of intent prior to grant of recognition under Clause 7(9) of NCTE Regulations 2007.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after considering oral arguments advanced during the presentation, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and set aside NRC's order dated 31.08.2009. Accordingly, the appeal was accepted and NRC's order dated 31.08.2009 was set aside with direction to the NRC to issue Letter of Intent prior to recognition to the institution under Clause 7(9) of NCTE Regulations 2007 within a period of 15 days.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Gurukul Bharti College of Education, Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Chandra Bhan Singh Memorial Shikshan Sansthan, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh dated 26/10/2009 is against the Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/F-7/UP-2858/144 Meeting/2009/8924 dated 28/08/2009 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds " 1) CLU is not submitted. 2) As per affidavit submitted by Management, the same land is in the name of two colleges".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Chandra Bhan Singh Memorial Shikshan Sansthan (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 27/10/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Uday Singh Chandel, Administrative Officer, Chandra Bhan Singh Memorial Shikshan Sansthan, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 02-12-09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that NRC never brought to the notice of the institution that a CLU was not submitted. NRC vide its letter dated 24-3-09 sought clarification from the institution on "State Govt. recommendation is negative and the name mentioned in the para 2 of the affidavit does not match with the name of the institution". The appellant submitted its clarification on the above points on 6-5-09 and also on 9-7-09.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that one of the refusal grounds with regard to CLU submission was never called from the institution by the NRC. The appellant showed to the Council CLU obtained from SDM office, Tehsil-Derapur dt. 5-10-09 stating that 1.254 Hec. of land was meant for educational purpose. It further noted from the reply of the institution dated 6-5-09 that the land was in the name of the society "Chandra Bhan Singh Memorial Shikshan Sansthan" and this was evident from the registered land documents and Khatauni papers. In view of the above the Council came to the conclusion that there was adequate justification in accepting the appeal, to be remanded to NRC for causing inspection of the institution.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal, set aside NRC's order dated 28-08-09 and remand the case to NRC for causing inspection of the institution to ascertain the availability of infrastructure and instructional facilities as per NCTE norms within 30 days from the date of issue of this order and thereafter pass appropriate order.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Chandra Bhan Singh Memorial Shikshan Sansthan, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of S.S. Degree College, Agra, Uttar Pradesh dated 27/10/2009 is against the Order No. F.NRC/F-7/UP-2783/147th Meeting/2009/9063 dated 28/08/2009 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds "B.A programme which is not permissible as per NCTE norms for B.Ed".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, S.S. Degree College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 28/10/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Dr. Hemendra Pathak, Representative, S.S. Degree College, Agra, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 30-11-09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that in response to NRC's letter dated 23.6.2009, a demarcated building plan for the existing B.A and proposed B.Ed programme was forwarded to the NRC on 20.7.2009 and B.A course has been shifted from the said building even before forwarding the demarcated plan.

AND WHEREAS in view of the above submissions of the appellant the Council came to the conclusion that the appeal deserves to be accepted and the matter remanded to the NRC for causing inspection of the institution and taking further necessary action.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal, set aside NRC's order dated 28-08-09 and remand the case to NRC for causing inspection of the institution to ascertain the infrastructure and instructional facilities as per the NCTE norms within one month of issue of this order and thereafter pass appropriate order.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of S.S. Degree College, Agra, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.
