**ORDER**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Om Shanti College of Education, Distt. Morena, Madhya Pradesh dated 30/03/2010 is against the Order No. F.WRC/NCTE/2010/RL-63915 dated 02/02/2010 of the Western Regional Committee, rejecting the application of the institution for grant of recognition for conducting D.Ed course on the ground "The institution has submitted land documents at Khasra No. 90 in which the land area is only 0.24 Hect i.e. 2400 sq.m which is less than 2500 sq.mt. as required in the NCTE Norms, 2009. The institute did not fulfill the condition as required in clause 8 (7) (i) of NCTE Regulations, 2009."

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Om Shanti College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 30/03/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri Pramod Gautam, Treasurer of Society and Kamal Kishore Jain, Secretary, Om Shanti College of Education, Distt. Morena, Madhya Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 18.06.2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the appellant institution has executed an agreement with the land owner for an area of 0.54 hecets i.e. 5,400 sq.mt. In the course of personal presentation the appellant admitted that there was a typographical error in the land document submitted with the application which showed the area of land sold as 0.24 hect. equal to 25875 sq. ft and a correction was carried out on 9.4.2010 to show that the area of land is 0.26 hect in place of 0.24 hect and 27846 sq. ft or 2587 sq.mts. instead of 25875 sq. ft.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that appellant has got the correction in the essential land document carried out only after the Western Regional Committee rejected the application. In the circumstances the Council came to the conclusion that the Western Regional Committee was justified in rejecting the application and therefore the appeal deserved to be rejected and the decision of the WRC confirmed.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and WRC's order dated 02-02-10 was confirmed.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.**

**ORDER**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Hari College of Management, Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh dated 12/10/2009 is against the Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/F-7/UP-3046/141st Meeting/2009/6051 dated 10/07/2009 of the Northern Regional Committee, closing the file of the institution for grant of recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the ground "Deficiencies communicated in the deficiency letter issued by the office are not removed within stipulated time."

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Hari College of Management (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 12/10/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri Lok Sharma, O.S., Hari College of Management, Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 18.06.2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the appellant did not receive the deficiency letter dated 21.11.2008. However the appellant sent a reply on 30.08.2008 in response to an earlier deficiency letter dated 23.07.2008 with which he enclosed copies of various documents.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that the deficiencies pointed out in the NRC's letter dated 21.11.2008 relates to (i) land documents, (ii) Building completion certificate, (iii) approved building plan and (iv) land use certificate. From the copies of the documents submitted by the appellant it was seen that the land was in the name of the trust which had been leased to the institution, there are two land use certificates dated 01.03.2008 for an area of 0.6560 hect. and dated 10.10.2008 for an area of 0.215 hect. obtained under Section 143 of the relevant U.P Act, the building plan had been approved by village Panchayat authorities and also a building completion certificate was available. The Council after considering all aspects of the matter has come to the conclusion that the appeal deserved to be accepted and the case remanded back to NRC for causing an inspection and taking further action thereafter.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was enough ground to accept the appeal and that it should be accepted, set aside the order of the NRC dt. 10-07-09 and remand the case to the NRC for causing an inspection and taking further action thereafter.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Hari College of Management, Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.**

**ORDER**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Adarsh Krishna College of Education, Distt. Mainpuri, Uttar Pradesh dated 05/05/2010 is against the Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/F-3/NRCAPP21/157 Meeting/2010/19740 dated 12/04/2010 of the Northern Regional Committee, rejecting its application for recognition for conducting D.Ed course on the grounds "1) Land document is not certified. 2) CLU is submitted after the due date, that is, 7 Nov.2009".

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Adarsh Krishna College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 05/05/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri. Raj Kumar, Clerk and Shri. Brajesh Kumar, Vice-Principal, Adarsh Krishna College of Education, Distt. Mainpuri, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 19-06-2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation, it was submitted that land document was duly certified, it was already submitted to NRC, the institution had obtained CLU from Competent Authority on 09-11-09 and the same was also immediately submitted to the NRC.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that Regulation 7(1-A) of the NCTE Regulations 2009 applicable in this case stipulated that application submitted online but not followed by dispatch, through registered post or by hand with seven documents mentioned at (i) to (vii) of Regulation 7(1) including certified copy of registered land documents issued by the Competent Authority and notarized copy of CLU issued by the Competent Authority within 7 days shall be considered as incomplete and shall be summarily rejected. The Council also noted that certified copy of land document was not submitted by the institution alongwith the application and it got the land document certified by the Competent Authority only on 10-06-10 i.e. much after rejection of the application and that the CLU submitted was not notarized. The institution also conceded in its appeal that the CLU was notarized on 09-11-09. The Council was, therefore, of the view that the application of the institution was rejected by the NRC for valid reasons and there was no ground for accepting the appeal.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and hence it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and NRC's order dated 12-04-10 was confirmed.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Bhagwan Adarsh Mahavidyalaya, Azamgarh, Uttar Pradesh dated 05/05/2010 is against the Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP\_3491/156 Meeting/2010/18240 dated 08/03/2010 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the ground "The reply of the institution has not been received in stipulated time till date".

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Bhagwan Adarsh Mahavidyalaya (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 05/05/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri. Arvind Yadav, Clerk and Shri. Chandrashekhar Singh, Coordinator, Bhagwan Adarsh Mahavidyalaya, Azamgarh, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 19-06-2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation, it was submitted that the Letter of Intent prior to recognition dated 04-11-09 allowing only 10 days for fulfilling the requirement was received by the institution on 12-11-09 and reply to the same was sent to NRC vide its letter dated 20-04-10. During the presentation, the representative also submitted that, in response to the letter of intent prior to recognition dated 04.11.09, the institution, vide its letter dated 13-11-09, had requested the NRC for grant of more time for fulfilling the requirement.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that it was not possible for an institution to fulfill the requirement of selection and appointment of qualified staff through duly constituted selection committee within a period of 10 days. The Council also noted that the institution had requested for grant of more time for fulfilling the requirement vide its letter dated 13-11-09 sent through registered post and that reply alongwith requisite documents were also sent to NRC on 20-04-10. The Council was, therefore, of the view that appeal of the institution should be accepted, NRC's order dated 08-03-10 should be set-aside and copies of institution's letter dated 13.11.2009 and 20/4/2010 alongwith enclosures should be forwarded to NRC with direction to the NRC for considering the reply of the institution dated 20-04-10 and taking appropriate decision thereafter.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after considering oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and set-aside NRC's order dated 08-03-10. Accordingly, the appeal was accepted and the NRC's order dated 08.03.2010 set-aside and the case was remanded to the NRC with direction to the NRC to consider the reply of the institution dated 20/4/2010 and to take appropriate decision, thereafter.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Bhagwan Adarsh Mahavidyalaya, Azamgarh, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.**

**ORDER**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Janki College of Education, Raigarh, Chhatisgarh dated 05/05/2010 is against the Order No. WRC/WRCAPP220/2010/67493 dated 30/04/2010 of the Western Regional Committee, rejecting its application for recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds "1) CLU is for commercial purpose. 2) Certified copy of the land documents not submitted".

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Janki College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 05/05/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Ms. Tripti Agrawal, Secretary and P. Das, Member, Janki College of Education, Raigarh, Chhatisgarh presented the case of the appellant institution on 19-06-2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation, it was submitted that the CLU application submitted by the institution vide letter dated 11.02.2009 was having three categories i.e. residential / commercial / industrial. Upon enquiring in the office of Tehsildar, they had advised that education would come under category 2 i.e. commercial as per the classification made by the office of the Tehsildar Raigarh. Accordingly, they converted the land as commercial (educational) purpose. As regard certified copy, it was submitted that in the initial stage of application, due to inadvertent mistake, the back side of the registered deed was not photocopied, which was observed by the WRC office and issued a show-cause notice vide letter No.FWRC/NCTE/2010/B.Ed.DL-64933 dated 13.02.2010 and after receiving this show-cause notice, the institution resubmitted (1) certified registered copy of the land document and (2) Naksha Bandi whereas WRC vide letter No.WRC/WR/CAPP220/2010/67493 dated 23/30.04.2010 rejected their application saying that the certified copy of land document was not submitted though it was submitted as per the requirement.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that the application of the institution was submitted on 31-10-09. Regulation 7(1-A) of the NCTE Regulations, 2009, applicable in this case, stipulated that application submitted online but not followed by dispatch, through registered post or by hand with seven documents mentioned at (i) to (vii) of Regulation 7(1) including certified copy of registered land documents issued by the Competent Authority, within 7 days shall be considered as incomplete and shall be summarily rejected. The WRC issued a deficiency letter dated 13-02-2010 pointing out five deficiencies including non-submission of notarized copy of change of land use and certified copy of land document allowing the institution to furnish the documents within a period of 60 days. The institution did not submit certified copy of land document to the NRC as required under Regulation 7(1) at the time of submission of application or even after issue of deficiency letter. Thus, the institution

did not fulfill the mandatory requirement of submission of certified copy of land documents. Therefore, the Council was of the view that there was no ground to accept the appeal.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and hence it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and WRC's order dated 30-04-10 was confirmed.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.**

**ORDER**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of MP Education Academy, Bhind, Madhya Pradesh dated 03/05/2010 is against the Order No. F.WRC/NCTE/2010/RL-66041 dated 22/03/2010 of the Western Regional Committee, rejecting its application for recognition for conducting D.El.Ed course on the grounds "The institution has submitted land documents Araj no. 176,178 and 179 in favour of Mantri City Central School Prasar Samiti, not in favour of proposed institution or society. Proposed institution is M.P. Educational Academy and society is City Central Shiksha Prasar Samiti. The institution did not fulfill the condition as required in clause 8(7) (i) of NCTE Regulations, 2009".

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, MP Education Academy (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 05/05/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri. Satya Prakash Tiwari, President, MP Education Academy, Bhind, Madhya Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 19-06-2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation, it was submitted that Society was having registered land in favour of secretary (Mantri) of society and not for individual and it was only in the name of society only. It was also submitted that the Society since amended the name of purchaser and a corrigendum was issued by the sub Registrar showing clearly the name of Society and that no show-cause notice was issued and the WRC directly issued rejection order which was not as per regulation 2009 and it was bad in law. It was further submitted that the institution was now having 0.68 hector land in favour of society.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that in the application submitted by the institution and the registration certificate dated 20-11-06 of the society, the name of the applicant society indicated was City Central Shiksha Prasar Samiti. However, in the land document submitted alongwith the application, the name of the purchaser i.e. owner of the land indicated was Mantri City Central School Shiksha Prasar Samiti. Therefore, the explanation given by the institution could not be taken at its face value. Therefore, the Council was of the view that the application of the institution was rejected by the WRC for valid reasons and thus there was no ground to accept the appeal.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and hence it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and WRC's order dated 22-03-10 was confirmed.

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Mata Jiyo Devi College of Education, Hisar, Haryana dated 07/11/2009 is against the Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/F-7/HR-1320/139 MEETING/2009/1923 dated 11/05/2009 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting M.Ed course on the ground "Deficiency communicated in the deficiency letter by the office are not removed within stipulated time."

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Mata Jiyo Devi College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 09/11/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri Subhash Sheoran Sharad Dubey, Director, Mata Jiyo Devi College of Education, Hisar, Haryana presented the case of the appellant institution on 22.06.2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the appellant submitted an application for the proposed M.Ed. course on 30.12.07; the NRC vide its deficiency letter dt. 19.06.08 as the institution for submission of an affidavit on Rs. 100/- stamp paper stating the total land and built-up area availability for B.Ed. and M. appointments have been done following the laid down procedure. In view of this the Council came to the conclusion that there was adequate justification in accepting the appeal with a direction to NRC to issue formal recognition order in continuation to the conditional letter dt. 09.09.2006 in order to safeguard the interest of the already passed out/ admitted students.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after considering oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and set-aside the NRC's order dated 14.05.2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation, it was submitted that the institution had submitted photocopy of registered land documents and original at the time of application on 31-10-2009 and, after that, submitted notarized copy of registered land documents and khatauni documents on 08-03-10; since original copy of CLU u/s 143 was submitted on 08-03-10 and original documents were not normally notarized, the objection that CLU was not notarized was not in order and the institution did not hide any information about any programme run by it.

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Janhit Degree College, Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh dated 13/05/2010 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/F.3/NRCAPP 406/159 Meeting/2010 dated 15/05/2010 of the Northern Regional Committee, rejecting its application for recognition for conducting D.E.C.Ed course on the grounds "1) FDR of Rs. 5 lakh has not been submitted. 2) Registered land document is not certified. 3) Submitted building plan is not approved by the competent authority."

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Janhit Degree College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 13/05/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri. Kavindra Chaudhary, Secretary, Janhit Degree College, Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 24.06.2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation, it was submitted that FDR of Rs. 5 lakh had been submitted to NRC on 08.01.2010; Certified copy Registered Land Documents by Sub- Registrar, Saharanpur had been submitted to NRC on 23.04.2010; Since the college was situated in rural area the building plan was approved by Gram Pradhan & Tehsildar, the competent authority in the rural area. The copy of approved building plan was submitted to NRC on 23.04.2010.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that, in the appeal, the institution itself admitted that FDR for Rs.5 lakh was submitted only on 08-01-10 and certified copy of Registered land document was submitted only on 23-04-10 i.e. much after submission of the application on 31-10-09. The institution also admitted that the approved building plan was submitted on 23-04-10. The Regulation 7(1-A) of the NCTE Regulations, 2009, applicable in this case, stipulated that application submitted online but not followed by dispatch, through registered post or by hand with seven documents mentioned at (i) to (vii) of Regulation 7(1) including FDRs, certified copy of registered land documents and approved building plan issued by the Competent Civil Authority within 7 days shall be considered as incomplete and shall be summarily rejected. The Council was, therefore, of the view that certified land document, FDRs and approved building plan as required were not submitted by the institution alongwith the application and, thus, the application of the institution was rejected by NRC for valid reasons and, therefore, there was no ground to accept the appeal.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it

should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and NRC's order dated 15-05-10 was confirmed.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.**

**ORDER**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of N.K. Somani College, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh dated 14/05/2010 is against the Order No. WRCAPP180/REJECTION/133/2010/67448 dated 29/04/2010 of the Western Regional Committee, rejecting its application for recognition for conducting D.E.C.Ed course on the grounds "1) The original application for D.E.C.Ed. cannot be considered for D.El.Ed., as requested by the institution. 2) In response to the deficiency letter issued for D.E.C.Ed., the institution submitted documents for D.El.Ed., which is not acceptable for D.E.C.Ed. course."

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, N.K. Somani College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 14/05/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Shri. K.K. Verma and Shri. Navneet, Trust Member, N.K. Somani College, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 24.06.2010. In the appeal and during personal presentation, it was submitted that due to miss understanding the application was filled up by the applicant for D.E.C.Ed. course, this mistake was committed by the applicant due to the misunderstanding or due to the non understanding properly but within a week he came to know through another college owner at Gwalior Mr. Bhim Sain, Chairman of Shri Sai Baba College of Education I had wrongly mentioned D.E.C.Ed. in the application instead of D.El.Ed and immediately an application was sent for amendment indicating D.El.Ed. in place of D.E.C.Ed on 31 10.09 i.e. within 7 days.

**AND WHEREAS** the Council noted that while the name of the course shown in the application submitted was D.E.C.Ed, in the affidavit and other document submitted alongwith the application, the name of the course indicated was D.Ed. (D.El.Ed.). Therefore, the Council was of the view that the institution indicated D.E.C.Ed. course in the application, due to an inadvertent mistake as claimed by it. Therefore, the Council was of the view that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and set-aside the WRC order dated 29-04-10 with direction to the WRC to further process the application on merit, for D.El.Ed. course.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal and set-aside WRC's order dated 29-04-10 and remand back the case to WRC with direction to the WRC to further process the application on merit. Accordingly, the appeal was accepted and the case remanded back to WRC with direction to further process the case on merit, for D.El.Ed. course.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of N.K. Somani College, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh to the WRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.**

**WHEREAS** the appeal of Rajkoshal Shikshan Samiti, Bilaspur, Chhatisgarh dated 14/05/2010 is against the Order No. WRC/WRCAPP288/2010/67481 dated 30/04/2010 as modified by corrigendum No. WRC/APP288/133rd Meeting/2010 dated 04/05/2010 of the Western Regional Committee, rejecting its application for recognition of B.Ed course on the grounds "1) The converted area of land is only 3000 sq.ft which is inadequate as per NCTE norms. 2) Certified Copy of the land documents not submitted."

**AND WHEREAS** the Correspondent, Rajkoshal Shikshan Samiti (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 14/05/2010 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

**AND WHEREAS** Dr. R.D. Singh, Chairman and Shri. Ganesh Pd. Aggarwal, Secretary, Rajkoshal Shikshan Samiti, Bilaspur, Chhatisgarh presented the case of the appellant institution on 24.06.2010. The Council was, therefore, of the view that there was no ground to accept the appeal.

**AND WHEREAS** after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after considering oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and hence it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and WRC's order dated 30-04-10 as amended vide corrigendum dated 04-05-10 was confirmed.
