ORDER

WHEREAS The appeal of Adarsh Education Trust's Aditya College of Education, Junagadh Dist., Gujarat dated 17/01/2009 is against the Order No. WRC/APWO2707/323330/110th/2008/48683 dated 23/12/2008 of the Western Regional Committee, withdrawing recognition for conducting B.Ed. course on the grounds "1) Trust has no land and building of its own. 2) Building is shared for three courses. 3) Built-up area is inadequate. 4) Building belongs to another trust and rented for two years only. 5) Number of books in library inadequate. 6) It is found that another B.Ed. programme is also being run in the same premises.7) Teaching staff inadequate".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Adarsh Education Trust's Aditya College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 21/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri.D.L. Ram, President, B,H, Hadia, Trustee, Adarsh Education Trust's Aditya College of Education, Junagadh Dist. , Gujarat presented the case of the appellant institution on 01-04-09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution was granted recognition by WRC in a rented building and the Saurashtra Education Trust, a sister education trust was running a B.Ed. college in the same complex, but in another building. The appellant was in possession of 2900 Sq.mt. of land and 1500 Sq.mt. of built up area by August'08 and the institution would be shifting to new building after getting approval from Saurashtra University.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the appellant possessed own land and building only on 28-08-08 that is much after the date of inspection (09-06-08). It further noted from the VT report dated 09-06-08 " The trust has no land or building of its own; Building has been rented for two years from another trust; 3681 Sq.mt. of land and 3750 Sq.mt. of built-up area is available for B.Ed., Secondary, Higher Secondary School, Arts and Commerce college; Laboratories and library facilities are shared with school". the Council, therefore, came to the conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and that be rejected.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and WRC's Order dated 23/12/2008 withdrawing recognition was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

ORDER

WHEREAS The appeal of Anand People's Medicare Society's Shree P.M. Patel College of Education, Anand Dist., Gujarat dated 01/01/2009 is against the Order No. WRC/APWO0520/323143/110th/2008/48790 dated 23/12/2008 of the Western Regional Committee, withdrawing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds "land is allotted for medical and health care purpose".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Anand People's Medicare Society's Shree P.M. Patel College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 07/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Bipinchandra P. Patel President, Anand People's Medicare Society's Shree P.M. Patel College of Education, Anand Dist., Gujarat presented the case of the appellant institution on 01-04-09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the land was not given to medical centre, but it was given on lease to the Anand People's Medicare Society by the Anand Municipality. It was wrongly read "Medial" for the word "Medicare" and "Medicare" is the name of the trust and it was meant for providing education from nursery upto post-graduation in any discipline of education: As one of the foremost objectives of the society and the trust had been imparting education on various disciplines and B.Ed. college was one of them. Further, it was stated that there was no evidence on record that the land was given for medical and health care purpose.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted from page '2' of the Agreement between Anand Nagar Palika and Anand People's Medicare Society, "the land is given on lease for a period of 9 years subject to the conditions for "Medicare" - for the purpose of maintenance of public health and consequential educational activities and public purposes". So, the Council inferred from the lease agreement that the land was allotted to the society for the purpose of public health and related educational activities. It further noted from the VTR dated 03/07/08 that the institution was running many courses in the same campus. the Council, therefore came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and that be rejected.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and WRC's order dated 23/12/08 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS The appeal of Basaveshwar Education Society's Sant Gadge Maharaj B.Ed College, Nagpur Dist., Maharashtra dated 17/12/2008 is against the Order No. WRC/APWO0557/123930/100/2008/17214 dated 28/11/2008 of the Western Regional Committee, closing the file of the institution that has applied for conducting B.ED (M.H.E.)(Co-Ed) course on the grounds "WRC in its 110th WRC meeting held on November 12-14, 2008 came to the conclusion that the institution has not removed the deficiencies within the stipulated period of 90 days u/s 7.4 of NCTE Regulations 2005. Now therefore, the application is closed".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Basaveshwar Education Society's Sant Gadge Maharaj B.Ed College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 17/12/2008 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Dr. Sudhakar S. Moglewar, President, Sh. S.D. Ghodmare Admin. Officer, Dr. Sudhakars. Moglewar Basaveshwar Education Society's Sant Gadge Maharaj B.Ed College, Nagpur Dist., presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the appellant submitted its reply on 16-06-08, in response to the WRC's letter dated 21-4-08 after complying with the deficiencies within the period of 90 days, It was also stated that the society was having 2700 Sq.mt. of land on 30 years lease, from a private party and also purchased 1500 Sq.mt. of land on individual name, in 2006.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that WRC on 21.04.08 issued a letter saying that land should be on ownership basis, the institution in response to this submitted that it was having 1500 sq.mt. of land on ownership basis and 2700 Sq.mt on lease basis. As per sub-regulation 8(7) of Regulations 2007, the institution should have requisite land (2500 Sq.mt. for B.Ed. course) either on long term lease from Govt./Govt. institution or on ownership basis on the date of application" and whereas the institution was having 1500 sq.mt. of land on ownership basis which was inadequate as per norms and leased land of 2700 Sq.mt. was from a private party.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and WRC's order dated 28/11/2008, closing the file of the institution that had applied for conducting B.ED (M.H.E.)(Co-Ed) course was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

ORDER

WHEREAS The appeal of Besant Educational and Cultural Society's V.Venkadasamy Naidu College of Education, Virudhunagar Dist., Tamilnadu dated 21/12/2008 is against the Order No. F.SRO/NCTE/B.Ed/2007-2008/6199 dated 22/10/2008 of the Southern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds "1) The built up space available as per VT report and documents 14790 sq.ft. for proposed course is not adequate. 2) The approved building plan and building completion certificate from PWD Engineer are not submitted for verification of built up space available. 3) The furniture, books in the Library are not adequate for existing and proposed course. 4) The Management has not submitted exclusive land and building documents for existing D.Ed. courses. 5) Further, the SRC decided to cause inspection under Section 17 to verify the location/address, exclusive infrastructural and instructional facilities available for existing two D.Ed. courses of the Management".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Besant Educational and Cultural Society's V.Venkadasamy Naidu College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 31/12/2008 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Sh. S. Jaganathan, Representative, Besant Educational and Cultural Society's V.Venkadasamy Naidu College of Education, Virudhunagar Dist., Tamilnadu presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the college was having a built up area of 14790 Sq.ft. reported by the VT and it was just 210 Sq.ft. short of required 15000 Sq.ft. as per norms, and later the institution had put up additional extension building measuring 36'x32' (2304 Sq.ft.) and to this effect it submitted a completion certificate and building plan. It also submitted the bills to prove the purchase of extra furniture and additional books to meet the norms. With regard to point 4- it was stated that the management was having 7.91 acres land in the form of gift deed & it earmarked 1acre 67 cents of land at Sy. No.465/1 and 469/1A for B.Ed. course and it was running Besant LVR Teacher Training Institute and Karpagan Teacher Training Institute in different buildings.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution procured additional books and furniture in March, 2009, that is much after the date of inspection. It further noted that the building Completion Certificate dated 12.03.07, was not issued by a competent civic authority, and it was issued after the date of inspection and also after the date of Refusal Order and it did not specify the total built up area. Even building plan was not approved by competent authority and it indicated only 14790 sq. ft. of built up area. the Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and that be rejected.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and SRC's order dated 22/10/2008 refusing recognition to the institution for conducting B.Ed was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Bhagwant College of Education, Muzaffarnagar, Uttar Pradesh dated 26/12/2008 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/F-7/UP-2557/2008/65270 dated 05/11/2008 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting M.Ed course on the grounds " The NRC in its 132 meeting held on 11-14 September 2008 after considering the original file of the institution, NCTE Act, and Regulations published from time to time, noted that the institution has not replied, the NRC decided to reject the application and close the file and therefore, in terms of the above decision of the NRC, the application of Bhagwant College of Education, 18th Milestone, Bijnor Delhi Highway, Bhagwantpuram, Muzaffar Nagar - 251315 seeking recognition of M.Ed. course is hereby rejected and file is closed".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Bhagwant College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 30/12/2008 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Raghav Mehra, Admin. Officer, Bhagwant College of Education, Muzaffarnagar, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the letter of queries issued by the NRC, was not received in time and the institution straight away received refusal Order. It was also stated that the institution possess all the requisite infrastructural facilities and instructional resources as per norms, and this might be verified any time by NCTE.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution submitted a compliance report on 08.10.07 in response to the deficiency letter of NRC dated 30.08.07 and after examining this report NRC vide its letter dated 26.10.07 asked the institution to clarify the course wise total area, built up area and approved building plan within 21 days. For this letter the institution did not submit its reply and hence the NRC in its meeting held on 11-14th September, 2008 decided to close the file. The Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and that be rejected, as the institution failed to file the reply.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and NRC's order dated 05/11/2008 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Bhartiya Nagar Education Trust's Hiraba B.Ed. College For Women, Ahmedabad Dist., Gujarat dated is against the Order No. WRC/APWO2438/323268/110th/2008/49651 dated 14/01/2009 of the Western Regional Committee, withdrawing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds " 1) Land is not on ownership Basis".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Bhartiya Nagar Education Trust's Hiraba B.Ed. College For Women (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 17/12/2008 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Patel Rajesh Baldevbhai, Clerk, Bhartiya Nagar Education Trust's Hiraba B.Ed. College For Women, Ahmedabad Dist, Gujarat presented the case of the appellant institution on 02.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution had been granted recognition/permission for conducting B.Ed. course vide order dated 05.01.2007 and as per then Regulations the institution was having both land and building on long term lease. The conditions contemplated in the Regulations 2007 could not be made applicable to the Institute retrospectively in as much as the said condition is impossible condition to any institution to purchase and/or to have on lease from the Government for not less than 30 years after its establishment in 2006. Even otherwise, to comply with the condition, there would be change in the premises of any Institute and for that purpose a separate permission should have to be obtained by the said Institute, which would require an application from the Institute as if the new institution was being established.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the land was on 99 years lease basis in the name of the institution. It further noted from the VTR dt. 10.06.08 "Building under construction on a land measuring 1833.67 sq.mt. The building is on the land area measuring 736.7 sq.mt is with five floors, of which 3rd & 4th floors measuring 308.97 sq.mt each is exclusively leased out for B.Ed college. However other floors of the same building is having P.T.C. college and some of the portion used on sharing basis". the Council therefore came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting appeal and that be rejected as it did not possess land and builtup area as per norms, for conducting both P.T.C & B.Ed. course.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the WRC's order dated 14.01.2009 withdrawing recognition to the institution was confirmed

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS the appeal of Citizens Girls College, Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh dated 29/12/2008 is against the Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/F-7/UP-2411/2008/65198 dated 05/11/2008 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting M.Ed course on the grounds "The NRC in its 132 meeting held on 11-14 September 2008 after considering the original file of the institution. NCTE Act, and Regulations published from time to time, noted that the institution has not replied, the NRC decided to reject the application and close the file and therefore, in terms of the above decision of the NRC, the application of Citizens Girls College, Balram Nagar, Naini, Allahabad, Allahabad-211008 seeking recognition of M.Ed. course is hereby rejected and file is closed".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Citizens Girls College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 05/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri. Deepak Shukla, Lecturer, Citizens Girls College, Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 01-04-09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution did not receive NRC's letter dated 10.05.2007 and 03.07.2008.; The appellant had sought progress of their application vide letter dated 27.11.2007 and 29.07.2008 from NRC, but it did not get any reply. It was further stated that the institution applied for B.Ed course in 2006 and got recognition for conducting B.Ed. course, in 2007 and subsequent to this it applied for M.Ed., in 2007.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution applied for B.Ed. in 2006 and for M.Ed. in the subsequent year i.e. in 2007. As per Regulations 2007 "only institutions running B.Ed. programme are eligible to offer M.Ed. course except university Departments which may not be directly running a B.Ed. programme". It also noted that the institution in its application form did not mention that it was already conducting B.Ed. programme. It further noted from the file that institution did not reply to the NRC's letters dated 10.05.07 and 03.07.08. The Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and that be rejected.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and NRC's order dated 05/11/2008 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS The appeal of Dr. Ambedkar Hindi Sanskrit Vidyapith Bihar Cum Education & Training, Begusarai Dist., Bihar dated 15/01/2009 is against the Order No. ERC/7-91.8.56/2008/14634 dated 24/12/2008 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.T.C.(D.Ed) course on the grounds " 1) Certified copies of ownership documents of land i.e. Certified copies of Registered Sale Deed/Gift Deed/ Patta not submitted with affidavit on Rs. 100/- stamp paper in prescribed format and relevant information in application form not given. 2) Approved Building Plan with Plot No., Khata No., built up area, Khesra No. from, the Competent State Govt. AND WHEREAS Sh. R.M. Tiwari, MD & Sh.R.N. Paswan, Secretary, Dr. Ambedkar Hindi Sanskrit Vidyapith Bihar Cum Education & Training, Begusarai Dist., Bihar presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09 . In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the Secretary applied for sale deed of land on 25.10.08 and before obtaining the sale deed following due procedure, he got heart attack and was on bed rest. After his recovery the sale deed was obtained on 06.01.09 and the same was submitted to ERC. In the mean time the institution prepared a certificate of gift deed by Notary public of Begusarai court and sent it to ERC. It was further stated that the approved building plan and building completion certificate with plot No., Khata No., built up area and Khesera No. was submitted to ERC.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the building plan dated 15.03.94 did not indicate land and built up area details. It further noted that the institution possessed the land only on 06.01.09 that was after the date of Refusal Order and the gift deed was not registered. the Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and that be rejected as the institution did not possess requisite land at the time of application.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT Report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and ERC's order dated 24/12/2008 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

Course will be opened with Plot No., Khata no. built up area, total area, Khesara No. from the Competent State Govt. Authority not submitted. 6) Plan for Sri Ram Shrestha Singh College lease out to HRD College of Teacher Training Education, Plot No. Khat No., Khesara No. not given in the Trace Map. Therefore, approved building plan where the proposed B.Ed. course will be opened with Plot No., Khata No, built up area, total area, Khesara No. from the Competent State Govt. Authority not submitted. 7) Details of website in prescribed proforma not submitted".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, H.R.E. College of Teacher's Training Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 20/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Rajeev Kumar, Secretary & Sh. Rajeev Ranjan, Chairperson, H.R.E. College of Teacher's Training Education, Muzaffarpur Dist., Bihar presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution replied on 03.12.08 to the ERC deficiency letter dated 30.11.07; Despite their acknowledgment of deficiency letter and request to grant 90 days time to submit the compliance report, from date of acknowledgment (i.e. 5-9-2008), the

ERC, NCTE has taken ex-parte decision, after issuing a letter on 20.10.2008, giving only 30 days time and the same letter was wrongly delivered to some unconcerned person. It was further submitted that both land and building were taken on lease on 21.11.08 for 30 years from R.S.S College, so it submitted approved building plan of R.S.S college and building completion certificate issued on 25.09.07 by Regd. architect. It was also stated that it converted 3 years lease deed into 30 years on 21.11.08.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution was issued a deficiency letter on 30.11.07 and a reminder notice on 20.10.08, to submit a compliance reply within 30 days. For this it replied to ERC only on 03.12.08, that was much after the stipulated time period. It further noted that the lease agreement executed on 13.09.07, submitted along with the application, was only for 3 years and the institution executed fresh lease deed for 30 years only on 21.11.08. It observed from the relevant Regulations of the NCTE "The institution /management shall at the time of making application, have in its possession adequate land/land building on ownership basis or land on long term lease basis." The Council, therefore, came to the conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and that be rejected, as it did not possess requisite land either on ownership basis or on long term lease basis at the time of submitting application. The lease was also not from Govt./Govt. Institution.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the ERC's order dated 23/12/2008 refusing recognition for B.Ed course with an intake of 100 from academic session 2007-08 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS The appeal of Jasidih B.Ed. College, Deoghar Dist., Jharkhand dated 21/01/2009 is against the Order No. ERC/7-91.8.16/2008/14619 dated 23/12/2008 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed course on the grounds " 1) The date of registration of Sale deed is on 12-11-2008 i.e. after the last date of receiving of application 31-10-2008. 2) Condition of Clause 8(7) of Regulations 2007 is not fulfilled".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Jasidih B.Ed. College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 21/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Kamdeo Dubey, Secretary, Jasidih B.Ed. College, Deoghar Dist., Jharkhand presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution acquired a total land of 2520 sq.mt (27130 sq. ft) in 4 phases – 820sq.ft. on 31.10.08; 6211sq.ft. on 3.11.08; 10899 sq.ft. on 6.11.08 and last chunk of 8707 sq.ft. on 12.11.08; However major portion of land as per requirement was registered prior to the 31.10.08 (last date of receiving of application). So, as per clause 8(7) of Regulations 2007, the appellant was having land on ownership basis; The delay so caused in the submission of the documents relating to the ownership of land and building in the Appellant Institute, was partly due to the cumbersome procedure prevailing in the State of Jharkhand in the transfer of lands.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution was having 17930 sq.ft. of land only (prior to 31.10.08) at the time of submission of application which was not adequate as per norms and it acquired 27130 sq.ft. of land by 12.11.08. As per Regulations, 2007, the institution should have 2500 sq.mt land as on the date of application either on ownership basis or on long term lease from Govt/Govt institutions. The Council therefore came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting the appeal and be rejected.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the ERC's order dated 23.12.2008 refusing recognition for B.Ed course(Marathi medium) with an intake of 100 from academic session 2008-09 was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS The appeal of Karnataka Educational & Welfare Trust's Taj M.Ed. P.G. Course, Gulbarga Dist., Karnataka dated 20/10/2008 is against the Order No. F.SRO/NCTE/M.Ed/2007-2008/5933 dated 08/10/2008 of the Southern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting M.Ed course on the grounds "1) The built up space as per building plan is 19098 for existing D.Ed., B.Ed. and proposed M.Ed course which is not adequate. 2) The furniture is not adequate. 3) The additional lab. equipment and books are not adequate for proposed M.Ed course. 4) The Reference books and Educational journals are not sufficient for proposed M.Ed. course".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Karnataka Educational & Welfare Trust's Taj M.Ed. P.G. Course (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 29/10/2008 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri M.K. Razak, Administrator and Shri Ashok Kumar, Office Superintendent, Karnataka Educational & Welfare Trust's Taj M.Ed. P.G. Course, Gulbarga Dist., Karnataka presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution was having 34,084sq.ft. of builtup area as shown in building plan and even visiting team reported 29894 sq.ft. of built up area available for the existing D.Ed, B.Ed. and proposed M.Ed. course. It was further submitted that the appellant procured additional furniture and books for the proposed course and to this effect the bills were shown.

In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the appellant received NRC's letter dated 28.04.2007, on its Allahabad address, acknowledging the receipt of their application; But it did not receive NRC's letter dated 05.05.2007 and other communications from NRC regarding closure of application; The appellant vide its letter dated 27.11.2007 and 29.07.2008 had sought status of its application from NRC and therefore contents of NRC letter dated 05.05.2007 were not known to them .

Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the NRC's order dated 05.11.2008 closing the file of the institution for conducting B.Ed. was confirmed.

College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 28/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Shri Bhupatsinh. D. Jadeja, Trustee, Shri R. Choasma Siddhartha, Clerk, Late Shri Ratansinhji Sodha Charitable Trust's Shri Sankardham B.Ed. College, Rajkot Dist., Gujarat presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution was granted recognition in March, 2007 and it started functioning from 2007-08 onward: WRC caused inspection of the institution u/S 17 on 09.06.08 and based on this report issued a show cause notice and the institution replied to the show cause notice on 03.09.08. It was further submitted that the institution was functioning as per the prevailing norms, applicable at that period of grant of recognition and it was ready to purchase land and construct a building as per new norms, if it would be given an opportunity.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted from the lease deed that the institution was having 1149.57sq.mt. of land, on which building was constructed in a residential colony and as per the building plan only 664.97 sq.mt. of built up area was available, which was highly inadequate as per norms. It further noted from the VTR dt. 9.06.08. The land was allotted to a cooperative society by Govt. and the society in turn leased out this land to the institution and this land was not registered in the name of the society and 664.97 sq.mt. building is used for both PTC and B.Ed., Building completion Certificate was issued for residence only. The Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting appeal and that be rejected, as it lacked adequate land and built-up area for conducting both P.T.C & B.Ed. courses.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the WRC's order dated 19.12.2008 withdrawing recognition to the institution was confirmed

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS an appeal dated 06/08/2007 by the Correspondent, Loyola College of Teacher Education, Cuddalore District, Tamilnadu (hereinafter referred to as the appellant) was filed against the Order No. F.SRO/NCTE/B.Ed/2006-2007/4305 dated 15/06/2007 of the Southern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed. course on the grounds "1) The Asbestos Sheets roofed building is inadequate. 2) Library books are inadequate. 3) Furniture is inadequate". The appeal was rejected by National Council teacher education (hereinafter referred to as the Council) vide Order dated 21/09/2007 on the grounds mentioned therein under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993.

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Loyola College of Teacher Education, preferred a fresh appeal dated 26/05/2008 in compliance of Hon'ble High Court of Madras Order dated 11/04/2008 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi.

AND WHEREAS C. Arokia Doss, Managing Trusty, Loyola College of Teacher Education, Cuddalore Dist., Tamilnadu presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the appellant's first appeal was rejected by the Appellate Order dated 21.09.07, on the ground "no relevant documentary Evidence could be produced". Appellant filed a W.P.No. 33056/2007, before the Hon'ble High court, Madras and the Court by its Order dt. 11.04.08, allowed the appellant to file an appeal once again and as per the direction it preferred the appeal . The appellant on during the hearing submitted that it removed Asbestos sheets roof, in July 2007. It was further submitted that it was having more than 7000 books in a full fledged multipurpose library and adequate furniture and in support of its claim it showed relevant original documents. So, the institution may be permitted to start new course from 2008-09.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the village panchayat issued a certificate on 30.08.07 stating that 2429 sq.mts. of built up area with RCC roof was available and it replaced asbestos roof with RCC, in July 2007 and this was also certified by a Regd. Engineer on 17th Aug. 07.

AND WHEREAS the Council further noted the following directions of the Hon'ble High Court : "the contention of the learned standing counsel is well found. Therefore this writ petition is disposed of permitting the petitioner to approach the first respondent once again by filing an appeal in which event, the first respondent shall consider the petitioner's appeal subject however to the condition that the petitioner produces all relevant documentary evidence in support of its stand that necessary infrastructural facilities are duly provided in the institution. If necessary, the respondents are also entitled to hold an inspection of the premises of the petitioner and ensure that such infrastructural facilities are fully provided before considering the petitioner's appeal for recognition and permission. In the event of the respondents deciding to grant approval for commencing the B.Ed. course by the petitioner, the respondents shall also decide as to from which academic year such course should commence".

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit VTR and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that the institution should be re-inspected to ascertain availability of necessary infrastructure, instructional and other facilities in accordance with the norms prescribed by the NCTE to become eligible for recognition by NCTE. Accordingly, the Council remanded back the case to the SRC for re- inspection of the Institution immediately and thereafter, to issue orders accordingly

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Loyola College of Teacher Education, Cuddalore Dist., Tamilnadu to the SRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Mahendra Educational Trust's Mahendhira College of Education, Namakkal Dist., Tamilnadu dated 20/11/2008 is against the Order No. F.SRO/NCTE/B.Ed-AI/2008/6662 dated 05/11/2008 of the Southern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed-AI course on the grounds "1) The management has not submitted the details of space provided for D.T.Ed., B.Ed. and proposed M.Ed. apart from the existing Arts and Science College. 2) Institution has not submitted reply to the notice issued by SRC within the stipulated time to 30 days. The notice had given a clear indication that any non-reply would attract final decision by SRC without any further notice".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Mahendra Educational Trust's Mahendhira College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 12/12/2008 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Prakash Sejwal, Project Coordinator, Mahendra Educational Trust's Mahendhira College of Education, Namakkal Dist., Tamilnadu presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the institution was having separate Infrastructure facilities for conductance of D.T.Ed., D.T.Ed-AI, B.Ed and B.Ed.-AI, and this was clearly indicated in the approved plans ; the total building was constructed exclusively to conduct the Teacher Education courses and it was having a total built-up area of 45,000 sq.ft. (12,000 sq.ft of space for D.T.Ed., 8,000 sq.ft.of space for D.T.Ed. Additional Intake, 15,000 sq.ft of space for B.Ed. and 10,000 sq.ft of space for the proposed B.Ed. Additional Intake). Due to Administrative reasons the Management was not willing to start the proposed M.Ed. course for this academic year. It was also stated that Arts and Science College was being running in a separate building with adequate facilities and the space provided for Arts and Science was 1.5 Lakhs sq.ft. It was further submitted that the explanation given by the institution vide its letter dated 15.11.2008 for the notice issued by the SRC-NCTE on 30.10.2008 was not considered by SRC-NCTE Bangalore.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the building plans and building completion certificates were undated and not approved by the competent civic authority. It further noted from the VTR dt. 31.08.07" The management has provided only one room & hall; No methodology and one more class room as per norms; There is need to provide facilities in E.T. lab, additional equipment in psychology lab, science lab; It has 10,293 sq.ft. for the existing B.Ed. and 3,308 sq.ft. for the proposed additional intake". The Council inferred from the VTR that the built up area and other facilities are inadequate for the existing course and the proposed additional intake. The Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting appeal and that be rejected.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the SRC's order dated 05/11/2008 refusing recognition to the institution for B.Ed (additional intake) was confirmed

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS the appeal of Mahesh Singh Yadav Teachers Training College, Gaya Dist., Bihar dated 22/01/2009 is against the Order No. ERC/7-91.8.10/2008/14863 dated 06/01/2009 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed. course on the grounds "1) Three sets of application completely filled in with signature in new prescribed format not submitted. 2) Information regarding Col. 5 of the affidavit not given. Affidavit also not in prescribed format. Therefore, fresh affidavit on Rs. 100/- stamp paper (in complete information) is not submitted. 3) Total area and built up area given in the affidavit are for different plot Nos. Plot Nos. 316, 314, 318 not given in the land document and application form. 4) Certified copies of ownership/ Lease documents of land in favour of the institution where the proposed B.Ed. course will be opened as per para 8(7) & 8(8) alongwith English version of land document duly notarized not submitted. 5) Building plan submitted by the institution in the name of the individual, Plot No. different those given in the affidavit and sale deed. Therefore, approved building plan with plot No., Khata No., Khesara No., Total area, built up area where the proposed B.Ed. course will be opened from the competent state Govt. authority not submitted. 6) Address in Col. 4.2 of the application is that of Plot mentioned in the Sale Deed. As per application form submitted by the institution building will be completed on 01.08.2012. Therefore, Building Completion Certificate with plot No., Khata No. Khesara No. Total area, Built up area where the proposed B.Ed. course will be opened from the competent state Govt. authority not submitted".

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Mahesh Singh Yadav Teachers Training College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 23/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Dr. Vijay Kumar Yadav, Managing Director, Mahesh Singh Yadav Teachers Training College, Gaya Dist., Bihar presented the case of the appellant institution on 01.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the appellant sent three sets of application, completely filled in with signature, in new prescribed format as enclosure no. 4 on 14.11.2008. It also sent the affidavit on 100/- rupees stamps paper in prescribed format in compliance. It was further submitted that the appellant had stated in its affidavit that the institution was owner of new plot no. 1015, 471, 474, 473, 952 under new Khata 161 and the said, Lands were at different cadestral Khata of 51, 56, 114, 112 and 13 of village Naili and the appellant purchased the said land through registered sale deed on 25.07.2008 for the purpose of construction of building of Mahesh Singh Yadav Teacher Training College and it would run the institution in the leased building till the completion of own building(2333.81 sq.mt), at Village Naili on the said revisional plot ; The appellant had already started the construction of the building on his purchased land at village Naili which is 2 k.m. away from Gaya town;

AND WHEREAS the appellant has already sent the certified copy of ownership documents of land in favour of the institution which is registered sale deed dated 25.07.2008; The appellant had also given the certified copy of lease of building with constructed area of 1500 sq.mt., which lies is over plot number 316, 314 and 318 in addition; The village Naili being a rural area, the building plan was approved by Mukhiya of Gram Panchayat Naili. As the building was under construction, the appellant could not submit the completion certificate; The appellant had never given in application that institution building would be completed by 01.08.2012.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the appellant purchased 2500 sq.mt. of land on 25.07.08, in the individual name and 1500 sq.mt of area was taken on 32 years lease from a private party, on 25.07.08, that was much after the date of the application (29.12.07). It further noted that the building plan was undated and area details were not indicated on it. The Council observed that the institution was not having requisite land either on ownership basis or on long term lease basis, as per norms, at the time of application. The Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting appeal and that be rejected

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the ERC's order dated 06/01/2009 refusing recognition to the institution was confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

AND WHEREAS Dr. Chandrant Hirani, Principal, Shree Arjunlal Hirani Jankalyan Trust's Smt. Bhartiben Hirani Mahila A.T.D. College, Rajkot Dist., Gujarat presented the case of the appellant institution on 02.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that on 03.03.2006, WRC Bhopal sent a letter to institution, showing 6 different deficiencies and the institution removed all the deficiencies and informed accordingly to WRC by a letter dated 12.05.2006: Later WRC sent a letter on 11.12.2006 to the institution showing 3 further deficiencies and instructed to remove it, in reference to this letter institution removed all the 3 deficiencies as shown by WRC and once again informed WRC accordingly, with all necessary, supportive and evidential documents by a letter dated 23.01.2007. WRC once again wrote a letter on 07.02.2007 to the institution and asked to solve further 3 deficiencies, as per the instruction, institute had clarified and removed all 3 deficiencies informed WRC vide its letter No. ATD/07, dated 05.03.2007

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution submitted its reply on 23.01.07, in response to the WRC deficiency letter dt. 11.12.06. and it also submitted translated copy of the legally valid land document. It further observed that NCTE had yet not developed norms and standards for A.T.D course. So, the norms and standards prescribed by the Govt. of Gujarat may be followed, till such time the NCTE develops the same for A.T.D course. the Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that the case may be remanded back to WRC for causing inspection of the institution by constituting a visiting team comprising of experts in the art discipline, subject to the conditions that the institution has infrastructure and instructional facilities as per state Govt. norms.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit and after hearing oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that the institution should be inspected to ascertain availability of necessary infrastructure, instructional and other facilities in accordance with the norms prescribed by the State Government to become eligible for recognition by NCTE. Accordingly, the Council remanded back the case to the WRC for inspection of the Institution immediately and thereafter, to issue orders accordingly

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Shree Arjunlal Hirani Jankalyan Trust's Smt. Bhartiben Hirani Mahila A.T.D. College, Rajkot Dist., Gujarat to the WRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted from the VTR dt.09.06.08 "the college does not possess its own land and building; B.Ed course is being run in the

cellar(basement)of APM mall, shopping center on rent basis; science lab is not sufficient; no play ground even in the vicinity ; few class rooms lack fresh air and light; the institution can not be considered for continuation of recognition in its present location" The Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting appeal and that be rejected, as the institution was running in a basement of shopping mall and purchased its own land after the date of inspection

Gami, Director, Shri Uma Education Trust's Shree Uma Bachelor of Education College, Rajkot Dist., Gujarat presented the case of the appellant institution on 02.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the land was located in rural area and the building plan was approved by Talati-Mantri(village head); "Uma Vidya Bhavan" Campus was in the name of Uma Education Trust and this trust gave on rent the building to two other trusts to run their colleges, namely (i) Shri Jalaram Education Trust B.Ed. College and (2) Shri Morvi Sarvajanik Kelavani Mandal's Rajkot B.Ed. AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the WRC's order dated 23.12.2008 withdrawing recognition to the institution was confirmed.

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Viklang Sarvangi Vikas Trust (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated 14/01/2009 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Patel Mangalabhai Somabhai, Managing Trustee, Sh. Patel Harshad. R., Member of the Trust, Viklang Sarvangi Vikas Trust, Dahod Dist., Gujarat presented the case of the appellant institution on 02.04.09. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the trust was running the college from 15-06-2006, in the building leased for 20 years and it would be completing three years in June - 2009. To fulfill the NCTE norms the Trust already purchased 4326 sq.mt non-agricultural land in March 2008 in the name of "Maa Gayatri B.Ed. College, Dahod" & it submitted an under taking stating that the construction of the new building with an area of 2502 sq.mt would be completed before June – 2009 as per the approved plan.

AND WHEREAS the Council noted that the institution purchased 4326 sq.mt land on 11.04.08; gram panchayat issued a construction permission certificate on 30.08.08 and building plan was undated. But gram panchayat issued a certificate on 30.03.08 saying that construction was in progress and this certificate appeared to be baseless as the institution neither possessed the land nor the construction permission by that time. It further noted from the VTR 09.06.08 that trust was not in possession of land , conducting P.T.C and B.Ed in the same building, located in commercial complex and the building was on 30 years rent agreement, infrastructure facilities were not as per norms, 2785 books were available for both the courses. It also noted from the rent deed dt.23.12.04 that 5565 sq.ft building with 8 rooms on first floor was meant for conducting the course. the Council, therefore, came to a conclusion that there was no justification in accepting appeal and that be rejected as there was no prudence to continue in the same building before it would shift to new building which was in progress.

AND WHEREAS After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT report and after hearing oral arguments advanced during hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was no ground to accept the appeal and that it should be rejected. Accordingly, the appeal was rejected and the WRC's order dated 22.12.2008 withdrawing recognition to the institution was confirmed

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.
